 Leonard was a 93 year old Veteran who served as a fighter pilot in World War Two. He was proud to serve his country and loved to talk of his service.



In 2013, aged 93, Leonard became unwell and was admitted to hospital. Sadly, it transpired that he had just months to live.



Leonard lived alone and had two loving daughters and many grandchildren. His family visited him in hospital every day.



 Leonard was fast-tracked for Continued Heath Care (CHC) funding so that he could be discharged to a Nursing Home before he died.



 A Nursing Home was found but the CHC payments did not cover the cost.
Leonard's family offered to top up the CHC payments from personal funds but this was refused.



 After a four month struggle, the case was referred to DMWS who immediately appealed against the CHC decision and sought funds from other sources.



Two months after DMWS's
 intervention, Leonard was moved to
 his preferred nursing home with all
 costs paid. DMWS refused to give up
 and fought for Leonard's right to die
 with dignity.



 Leonard was transferred to the Nursing Home on his 94th Birthday. After settling in quickly he passed away peacefully in his sleep two months later, with his loved ones all around him.
