Role Purpose

An exciting new opportunity exists to work within a supportive and collaborative team delivering a range of psychological services and interventions to emergency frontline workers at DMWS. The Principal Psychologist will have the opportunity to lead and develop a project which will address the specific needs of emergency service workers. DMWS are expanding their specialist clinical team and this new role will be key to extending the core welfare provision provided. The new post holder will enjoy a generous package of benefits and have the opportunity to shape a positive working environment.

Key Accountabilities

- To deliver a range of psychological interventions that are tailored to the needs of emergency service workers based on evidence research and practice.
- To develop pathways to provision including into other local and national services where appropriate
- To deliver awareness to staff and managers of how mental health support can be accessed and how to have supportive conversations with staff.
- Deliver clinical supervision to 'high risk' roles and develop a wider supervision model that will expand the reach across the organisation of professional support sessions offered to officers experiencing incidents that regularly expose them to trauma.
- To continually develop services provided to ensure it meets not just current need but grows to meet future demand in response to the evolving nature of need and evidence-based research.
- To work proactively with other clinical services and or academic institutions to trial interventions to build an evidence base of effective psychological interventions with emergency service workers to further develop and implement.
- To develop and deliver interventions that focus on preventative health measures to keep people in the workplace wherever possible, and to prevent staff from reaching crisis point.
- To improve the mental well-being, confidence, resilience and to promote effective self-management of service users.
- Providing high-quality emotional and practical support to NHS and or third sector employees, professionally and sensitively in particular to those who are working in demanding operational environments.

- Ensure the team are embedded in the local community with strong links and interactions with the local NHS Trusts. Co-ordinating and linking staff to local initiatives.
- Support individuals to access a wider range of support services and to utilise existing routes of support effectively.
- Promote a culture of innovation and excellence in service delivery.
- Increasing social interactions of service users to prevent isolation and enabling improvements in overall personal welfare.
- Process referrals through our own record systems, keeping regular and meticulous records of active service support up to date and progressing cases to conclusion.
- Promote the services of DMWS and market local activities to attract service user participation locally and generate referrals, through NHS Trusts and the local community within the agreed communications and project plan.
- Reporting to the Operational Manager and Head of Region this is an integral role which must align to the strategic purpose of DMWS.
